Gospel Meditation:

When I was a young priest, about one year after ordination, I was called to the hospital to anoint a dying mother of three young children. She had a painful, terminal cancer. After celebrating Last Rites with her, I said, "Don't be afraid." She looked me square in the eye from her hospital bed and said, "Oh Father, I am in a lot of pain, but I am not afraid. Something wonderful is about to happen." A few days later she died.

Christians face the ending of our personal various "*worlds*" in a totally unique way. This first Sunday of Advent, Jesus says that when people see their world falling apart, they find themselves "*fainting with fear and with foreboding of what is coming on the world*" (*Luke 21:26*). In our fear, our natural response is to check out, to hide our heads in drunkenness, distraction, and false securities. But Jesus commands us to "*look up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near*." He then compares what's coming to a lovely summer in full bloom. That's what the cross and resurrection empower us to do, as strange as it may seem.

Advent challenge: What world in your life is collapsing? A relationship, a dream, a work opportunity? Maybe you're troubled by a crumbling world in the political or economic sphere. Or maybe someone you love is seriously ill or dying. Name that world or worlds.

Then pray: "Lord, help me to not faint with fear. Help me to raise my head and see your redemption coming."

<u>Meditación del Evangelio:</u>

Cuando era un joven sacerdote, aproximadamente un año después de la ordenación, me llamaron al hospital para ungir a una madre moribunda de tres niños pequeños. Tenía un doloroso cáncer terminal.

Después de celebrar la extremaunción con ella, le dije: "*No tengas miedo*". Me miró directamente a los ojos desde su cama de hospital y dijo: "*Oh, Padre, tengo mucho dolor, pero no tengo miedo.*

Algo maravilloso está a punto de suceder". A los pocos días murió ella.

Los cristianos enfrentamos el final de nuestros diversos "*mundos*" personales de una manera totalmente única. Este primer domingo de Adviento, Jesús dice que cuando las personas ven que su mundo se desmorona, se encuentran "*desfalleciendo de miedo y de presentimiento de lo que viene sobre el mundo*" (*Lucas 21:26*). En nuestro miedo, nuestra respuesta natural es salir, esconder la cabeza en la embriaguez, la distracción y las falsas se-

guridades. Pero Jesús nos ordena: "Levanten la vista y levanten la cabeza, porque su redención se acerca".

A continuación, compara lo que se avecina con un hermoso verano en plena floración.

Eso es lo que la cruz y la resurrección nos dan poder para hacer, por extraño que parezca.

Desafío de Adviento: ¿Qué mundo en tu vida se está derrumbando? ¿Una relación, un sueño, una oportunidad de trabajo? Tal vez estés preocupado por un mundo que se desmorona en la esfera política o económica. O tal vez alguien a quien amas está gravemente enfermo o moribundo. Nombra ese mundo o mundos. Luego ora: "*Señor, ayúdame a no desfallecer de miedo. Ayúdame a levantar mi cabeza y ver venir tu redención*".

Question: What's the story behind the Advent wreath?

Answer: Each season in the liturgical calendar comes with its own local and regional rituals.

During the Advent season, wreathes adorn church sanctuaries and family dining room tables. You may have said Advent wreath prayers in childhood or taken a turn lighting the candles. The Advent wreath is full of symbolism about Christ and his coming at Christmas. The wreath is made of evergreen boughs, reminding us that the life of grace doesn't falter with the changing seasons. It always remains fresh and new. Similarly, a circular wreath reminds us of the eternal, neverending nature of God's love.

Candles remind us that Christ is the light of the world, the One who "shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." We use four candles to represent each week of Advent. Traditionally they come in the liturgical colors of the season. Purple has historically represented penance and sacrifice. We see the same color for the season of Lent. On the third Sunday of Advent, however, we light a rose color. The priest will wear rose vestments at Mass. This is Gaudete Sunday. *Gaudete* means "*rejoice*" in Latin. On the third Sunday of Advent, we're roughly halfway through the season. The Church chooses the midpoint to remind us to celebrate in the midst of our anticipation! Whatever the color and whatever the day, the Advent wreath is a beautiful practice to focus our attention on Christ's coming at Christmas.

Pregunta: ¿Cuál es la historia detrás de la corona de Adviento?

Respuesta: Cada estación del calendario litúrgico viene con sus propios rituales locales y regionales.

Durante la temporada de Adviento, las coronas adornan los santuarios de las iglesias y las mesas de los comedores familiares. Es posible que hayas rezado oraciones de la corona de Adviento en la infancia o que hayas tomado un turno para encender las velas. La corona de Adviento está llena de simbolismo sobre Cristo y su venida en Navidad. La corona está hecha de ramas de hoja perenne, recordándonos que la vida de gracia no flaquea con el cambio de estaciones. Siempre se mantiene fresco y nuevo. Del mismo modo, una corona circular nos recuerda la naturaleza eterna e interminable del amor de Dios.

Las velas nos recuerdan que Cristo es la luz del mundo, Aquel que "*resplandece en las tinieblas, y las tinieblas no han prevalecido.*" Usamos cuatro velas para representar cada semana de Adviento.


Tradicionalmente vienen en los colores litúrgicos de la temporada. El púrpura ha representado históricamente la penitencia y el sacrificio. Vemos el mismo color para la temporada de Cuaresma. En el tercer domingo de Adviento, sin embargo, encendemos un color rosa. El sacerdote usará vestiduras rosas en la Misa. Este es el domingo de Gaudete. *Gaudete* significa "*regocijarse*" en latín.

En el tercer domingo de Adviento, estamos aproximadamente a la mitad de la temporada. ¡La Iglesia elige el punto medio para recordarnos que debemos celebrar en medio de nuestra anticipación! Sea cual sea el color y el día, la corona de Adviento es una hermosa práctica para enfocar nuestra atención a la venida de Cristo en Navidad.
